Fact #1: Among the top eighteen	
industrialized nations in the world, the United States ranks ninth in the	-
world in enrollment but dead last in	
completion rates.	
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Fact #2: According to colleges and employers, young adults are less	
successful at college and in the workplace not for lack of academic	
knowledge, but for lack of "soft	
skills" like endurance, self-reliance, communication, resourcefulness, and	
problem-solving.	

Other issues at hand:

- The students taking leadership courses are not necessarily the ones who need it most
- Perceived lack of relevance for FCS courses/ clubs (when the opposite is true)
- Competition from other programs (e.g., STEM) for funding and "airspace"
- Increasingly prescribed programming

- To be at the forefront of life skills development for college, career, and life readiness
- To be viewed as the solution and becoming more mainstreamed in schools
- To engage local business communities (funding, support)
